WASHOUGAL - Charles F. Everett, a former lumber yard worker and motel owner/operator in Long Beach, Wash., died in Portland Saturday. He was 81. He was born Aug. 29, 1902, in Coleridge, Neb., and last lived at 1553 G St.

Mr. Everett was a member of the North Bank Lodge of the Masons and the Flutter Wheels Square Dance Club of Vancouver. A resident of Washougal in 1938, he lived in Long Beach from 1948 to 1968, when he returned to Clark County. He had been a square dancer since 1949 and was - an original member of the Flutter Wheels club.
