

Fremont Alva Everett
December 16, 1918-April 30, 2001

A memorial service for Fremont Alva Everett was held Saturday, May 5, 2001 at St. John's Presbyterian Church in Camas, Washington where he had been a member for 50 years. Fremont Alva Everett passed away at his home in Vancouver, Washington. Fremont's ashes will be placed at Willamette National Cemetery in Portland, Oregon.

He was born to Harold and Roseltha Tranmer Everett on December 16, 1918 in Patterson, California. The family lived various places in Oregon and Washington, returning to the family home in Lyons, Nebraska in 1929, the town his ancestors helped settle.

He graduated from Lyons High School in 1936, and worked at various jobs among [which] were the Lyons Bakery and Cafe and the Lyons Lumber Company.

On his 20th birthday, he was united in marriage to Doris Theibault the daughter of Louis and Zella Newill Theibault. They moved to the Camas, Washington area in 1941 where they continued to make their home until moving to Van Mall retirement community in March of this year.

Fremont served in this U.S. Navy in the Pacific area from 1944 until 1946. He was a member of the VFW and past master of the Masonic Lodge in Camas. He was preceded in death by son Monty in 1947; parents; brothers, Franklin and Clifford and sister Meredith Stoller.
