Eulogizes Local Man

Pasadena 'News' Praises young man who perished in Times' Disaster Sunday

The Pasadena 'News' eulogises Churchill Harvey-Elder, the local young man who perished in Times' disaster ... Mr. Elder is a grandson of Col Harvey, who is very prominent in Whittier. During his boyhood Mr Elder lived with his grandparents, the Harveys ... Early in his twenties he went to Germany for a year ... Upon leaving he took for a wife a brilliant little New York girl who had established something of a name as a playwright in the eastern metropolis. ... When he returned to Pasadena his grandfather purchased a newspaper plant at Whittier and gave it to the young man, but he disliked to dally with the money-making end ... and sold the plant. Became Pasadena correspondent for the Los Angeles 'Times' ... went to Honolulu as a special correspondent of the 'Times', but about six months ago returned to Los Angeles where he assumed the position of night editor....His wife has been engaged in newspaper work for years, and is said to be wonderfully clever writer. At present she is a member of the San Francisco Chronicle ...Mrs Elder, it is said, once received the compliment of having her picture published in Chicago and San Francisco as the most beautiful woman in America.
