

# Deborah Barker Eustis 1817-1892

Death of Mrs. Eustis The death of this venerable lady last Wednesday, in Augusta, caused feelings of sorrow in many households in Beaufort, where she was known and valued for her great Christian attributes and charitable good works. She had lived a long and useful life, and our regret at her death may come to us some day as a joy that she was removed into that region where my Father hath many mansions.

Mrs. Eustis was the relict of the late Chas. L. Eustis, of Maine, a man of great probity and thoroughly esteemed in Beaufort, where he made his home for years. She was the mother of Mrs. P.M. Whitman, of Augusta, formerly of Beaufort, and of Messrs. George B. and Chas. Eustis, of Minneapolis, Minn. Mrs. Eustis came South in 1827 and has lived here almost all the time since. She visited her sons last winter and contracted the grip, since which time her health has been feeble. The remains were laid to rest in St. Helena Churchyard last Thursday. We offer our sympathies to those who sorrow for the departure of this good woman, and hope and believe the Maker of all has said unto her "Come unto me thou good and faithful servant."
