Washington [DC] Post, April 20, 1915. Washington Post, Apr 20, 1915 New York April 19 George Dexter Eustis, head of the banking and brokerage firm of George Eustis & Co. of Cincinnati, Ohio, died in Roosevelt Hospital tonight following an operation for appendicitis, performed Sunday.

Mr Eustis was one of the best known men of the middle West. He was born in Cincinnati in 1870, and was educated in that city. He entered his father's banking concern at an early age, and became a member of the firm soon after he attained his majority. He succeeded his father as head of the firm on the latter's death some years ago.

He was a director of the Little Miami Railroad Company, a subsidiary of the Pennsylvania system, and vice-president of the Cincinnati Gas and Electric Company. Although he was not a politician, he took an active interest in civic affairs, and was prominent in movements designed to advance the interests of his home city. He leaves a wife and two sons.
