

**Funeral Rites Held
Wednesday for
Mrs. L. L. Shumway**

Funeral services were held for Mrs. Helen M. Shumway from the First Presbyterian church in Lyons on Wednesday, December 2, with the Rev. Donald Bump officiating.

Mrs. Shumway died at the Oakland hospital Monday morning after being hospitalized over the week end. She had been ill for some time.

Obituary

Helen Newmyer Shumway, daughter of William S. and Ethel Newmyer, was born in Lyons on June 16, 1898 and died in the Oakland Memorial hospital on November 30, 1964, at the age of 66 years.

She received her early education in Lyons and studied music at the University of Nebraska in Lincoln. She participated in Chatauqua tours for several seasons as a violinist in a string orchestra, traveling in New England and the eastern seaboard. Mrs. Shumway was active for many years as a music teacher and performer in Lyons. She was a life-long member of the First Presbyterian Church of Lyons, joining the church on May 12, 1912. Mrs. Shumway was also active in the United Presbyterian Women's Organization, Church School and Choir, PEO, Eastern Star, Women's Legion Auxiliary.

On December 22, 1926. Helen was married to Lorin L. Shumway of Lyons. To this union were born two daughters and one son. Mrs. Shumway was preceded in death by one daughter. Lois Jean, and a sister, Mrs. Clara Christensen. She is survived by her husband, a son Stanley of Laurence, Kansas, a daughter, Mrs. Mary Rounsborg of Oshkosh, Nebraska, a brother, I Clay Newmyer of Lyons, and eight grandchildren. 3 Dec 1964
