

Mahlon Manson Denehie 1862-1925

FIREMAN SUMMONED

M. M. Denehie, Volunteer Fire Fighter, Is Called.

Mahlon Manson Denehie, 65, one of the original members of the city's volunteer fire department, formed more than thirty-five years ago, died Monday evening at his home, 2414 Kulshan street, after forty-four years' residence here. He had been ill more than a year. In the early days of Whatcom he was employed as a butcher in the West Holly street market of Nolte Bros. Mr. Denehie was a member of Olalla camp No. 383, W. O. W.

Surviving relatives are the widow, Mrs. Anna Denehie; two sons, Austin and Linus Denehie of this city; one stepdaughter, Mrs. Niela Lyman, San Francisco; one sister, Mrs. Louis Evans, Terra Haute, Ind.; and one granddaughter, Jerry Anne Denehie.

Funeral services will be held at Arthur C. Harlow's chapel at 1 p. m. Wednesday, with spiritualistic services. Cremation will follow.
