

Mary Amanda Piper Everett 1863-1923

Well Known Woman Passes Away Mon.

Mrs. E. B. Everett, age 59, one of the most widely known and highly esteemed residents of this vicinity, quietly passed away at her home Monday evening. The deceased had been in ill health for a number of months and death was not unexpected. The late Mrs. Everett spent practically her entire life here and in that time acquired innumerable friends.

Obituary.

Mary Amanda Piper was born June 2, 1863, in Franklin County, Pennsylvania. She died at her home in Lyons, Monday night, April 2, 1923, aged 59 years and 9 months.

When about three years of age she moved with her parents to Orrville, Ohio, where she resided until she was sixteen. At that time she came to Nebraska where she has since resided. At an early age she united with the Christian church of Orrville, Ohio, and later she transferred her membership to the Presbyterian church of Lyons, of which she remained a member to the last. March 11, 1886, she was joined in marriage to Mr. E. B. Everett, and to this union there were born seven children, three of whom died in infancy. Beside her husband there remain the four children, Mrs. H. T. O'Connor, Lucy, Burton and Nellie, also one grandchild, Edward O'Connor, and one brother, Mr. J. P. Piper of Sioux City, Iowa.

The funeral services were held April 4, 1923, at 2:30 o'clock. They were in charge of the Rev. J. H. Salsbury, D. D., pastor of the local Presbyterian church. The music for the occasion was provided by a quartette composed of Mesdames Wigton and Stiles and Messrs. Heyne and C. S. Newmyer. Burial was had in the Lyons cemetery immediately following the services.
