

Sarah Virginia Peck Everett 1834-1919

Old Resident Passes Away

Mrs. Sarah Virginia Everett died at her home west of Lyons, Thursday, Nov. 6, 1919, after an illness of two weeks, the immediate cause of her death being from a fall, which she had as a result from her foot slipping while at her duties in her home. She was the widow of the late Andrew Everett who died about seven years ago, and with whom she spent 62 years of married life.

Mrs. Everett was 85 years and 1 week old at the time of her death, and in the many years of her residence, having come here in 1867, she was known as a very lovable woman; a homebody, but withal a woman who had many friendships that have lasted more than a half a century. She was a bright woman of mental ability, and though modest and retiring her early life in this community will be remembered by her many kindnesses in sickness and disaster among the old neighbors back in the homestead days, when doctors and nurses were not so easily secured. Rev. John Spencer had charge of the funeral services and interment took place in the Lyons Cemetery. The pallbearers were six of the grandsons: Howard, Myron and Leland Paine, Frank, Irving and Alva Roscoe. There are two daughters and two living sons to whom we extend our sympathy, as follows: Mrs. Sayles Paine and Mrs. B. S. Roscoe, of Lyons; Irving Everett of Kila, Mont, and Arthur Everett of Los Angeles, Cal., the eldest son having been drowned in Logan Creek many years ago, at the age of 22 years.
