

# William A Mann 1857-1904

Lyons [NE] "Mirror", 7 July 1904 . Word was received here that William A. Mann died last week in Mexico and was buried down there. He died of brights disease and was 42 years of age, leaving two daughters, Mildred and Hazel of this place to mourn his death.

He was employed on the Pan American railroad and died near where the death of J.B. Lyon occurred.

Lyons [NE] "Sun", 7 July 1904. J.D. Mann received a letter Wednesday conveying the sad intelligence of the death of his son Wm. Mann who died in Mexico June 25th. The cause of his death is said to have been Brights disease. Mr. Mann went to Mexico last January and was employed in the construction of the Pan American railroad. The climate did not agree with him and his general health during his stay in Mexico was so poor that he had made up his mind to return home at an early date, though on June 19th, he wrote both his father and little daughter Hazel that he was improving and feeling much better. Mr. Mann was well known in this section and was an active business man in Lyons having conducted a meat market and ice business and for the past two years had charge of the County Bridge Building.

His wife died about four years ago. He leaves two daughters, Millie and Hazel, who with his father, sisters, and brothers have the sincere sympathy of their neighbors and friends. LWS.
